Regulations for the International Student Scholarship

- Article I In order to facilitate the internationalization of the National University of Kaohsiung (“NUK”) and in correspondence to the policy of the Ministry of Education (“MOE”), to encourage the international enrollments, NUK sets up a scholarship policy to encourage international enrollments and hereby establish the “NUK Regulations for the International Student Scholarship” (hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations”).
- Article II A qualified applicants for the NUK International Student Scholarship (hereinafter referred to as the “Scholarship”) must be an international student officially registered in NUK and meets the requirements as follows:
- I. College student:
 - (I) At least six credits granted for each semester.
 - (II) The total average grade of academic and conduct evaluation of the last semester is higher than 65 and 75 respectively, and no record of wrongful behaviors.
 - II. Graduate student:
 - (I) At least 4 credits granted for each semester.
 - (II) The total average grade of academic and conduct evaluation of the last semester is higher than 75 and 75 respectively, and no record of wrongful behaviors.
 - (III) If the grade of academic evaluation of the last semester is unavailable due to the preparation of the Master/Doctor thesis, the application may be submitted with the recommendation letter from the advisor or the contents of thesis, provided that such application may be submitted twice by each applicant at most.
- Article III The Scholarship policy under this Regulation includes Scholarship and stipend and in principle the Scholarship is categorized as tuition-free, academic fees-free, academic fees-half free, fixed amount of monthly scholarship and full scholarship including academic fees. The stipend is categorized as research assistant, instructing assistant and part-time hourly rate payment. Except for the full scholarship, other categories of

scholarship may be in different combination depending on actual needs.

Article IV The selection process of the freshmen shall work with the admission process of the Academic Affairs Office to endeavor reviews of applications of international students.

A current student of NUK may submit the application form with the transcript and other relevant documents to the International Affairs Office overseas student and foreign student branch by the end of March each year.

Article V The maximum period of each scholarship is four years for undergraduate programs, two years for master programs, and four years for doctorate programs. The awarding period for all categories of scholarship is generally from September to August of the following year. Except for the portions of academic fees, insurance, accommodation, Chinese course fees, etc., which must be paid at the beginning of the first semester, the remainder of the stipends are paid monthly during the awarding period until the expiration of the awarding period, graduation, dismissal or suspension upon which the payment will be ceased.

If any grantee of the scholarship receives a punishment higher than warning during the awarding period and the “International Student Scholarships Selection Committee” has approved to cancel his/her grantee qualification, the deregistration of the grantee qualification will be effective from the following month of the confirmed cancellation.

Article VI Quotas of the Scholarship will be allocated by considering:

- I. The total amount of the Scholarships per semester, which is capped by the sources of the actually available Scholarship.
- II. Quotas granted for the Scholarship are to be calculated and allocated by the allocated amount out of the total Scholarship amounts of the then current semester, which is decided by the proportion of the student number of “freshmen and the registered”, and “college, master and doctorate program”.

Article VII The selection of the Scholarship is to be conducted by the criteria set for the applicant’s performances in the previous semester for various aspects as follows:

- I. Professional Performance – 40%,
- II. Academic Performance – 30%,
- III. Other Activities and Services – 30%.

Article VIII The members of the International Student Scholarships Selection Committee include Dean of the Academic Affairs, Dean of the Student Affairs, Dean of the International Affairs and the representative of each college. The Dean of the International Affairs will serve as the Chairman.

Article IX The sources of the Scholarship include:

- I. Aiding fund from the MOE;
- II. Aiding funds from other governmental entities;
- III. NUK student aiding committee;
- IV. Income of NUK; and
- V. Other sources.

Article X This Regulation has been approved by the Executive Meeting and the NUK endowment fund management committee and is to be announced and executed after the approval of the President. The same rule will be applied to the amendment thereto.
